Membership Retention

We are in the midst of Mission 1.5, a mission to grow membership in Lionism. Globally we are losing ground, and the latest membership numbers show that we are losing ground in our District 5NE membership. 74 Lions members have been dropped from our District roll since July 1. That is about 6% of our members that have left Lionism. A decrease in membership will decrease the amount of service that our clubs can do. These members must be replaced and some bright news is that 45 new Lions have joined clubs in our district. While we should be bringing some new clubs online shortly, we have had a net loss of 29 members in the district.

Certainly there are valid reasons for someone leaving a club. Our membership is aging and about 20 to 30 Lions pass away each year. Others move away. There is nothing that we can do about those types of losses, but we must do a better job about retaining our other members.

How do we retain members?

- 1. Of primary importance is communication. If you have not seen a member for a while, then contact them. Don't stretch this beyond two months. Don't assume that everything is good. Make a contact. A phone call or a personal visit is far more impactful than e-mail or a text message. Go out for coffee and directly ask if there is a reason for their non-participation.
- 2. Recognize the accomplishments of the Lions in your club. Give an award for exemplary service. Even for the little things it is important to thank and recognize those who are helping. Sometimes a thank you note

or recognizing service at a club meeting can help make a Lion feel appreciated.

- 3. Mentor new Lions. Each Lion has a sponsor when they are inducted into a club. That Lion should be introducing the new Lion to the rest of the club, explaining the workings of the club and encouraging the Lion to participate in club activities. Too often a new Lion is left to sink or swim once they have been inducted. Being a sponsor is an ongoing commitment.
- 4. Invite your members to participate in service projects. If someone is on the fence, a personal invitation is more apt to get that Lion involved.
- 5. Have an orientation for your members. Orientation is not just for new members. There are probably several members in your club that can benefit from learning more about Lions.
- 6. Evaluate your club. Take a look at what you are doing and where you can improve. In our District we have several people who can help your club with a SWOT Analysis. That examines your club's Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities and Threats. Contact your District Governor if you would like to spend a couple of hours examining your club to make it better.
- 7. If someone is leaving your club, do an exit interview. Find out what the good experiences were and what needs to be improved. If they are moving away, help connect them to another club.
- 8. If dues are a problem for an older Lion, then your club can consider a Lifetime membership for that Lion.

It is available for a) Lions who have served for at least 20 years and who have rendered outstanding service to his or her club or community or the Lions Association, or b) any Lion who has served for 15 years or more and is over the age of 70 years, or is critically ill. Lifetime membership is only granted upon recommendation of the club, payment by the club of \$500 to LCI and approval by the International Board of Directors. There is a form to submit.

Under Mission 1.5 we are charged with growing our organization. Continue the good work of recruiting new members. We are going to need an average of 2 to 3 new members for each club this vear to stay on track. Consider asking a spouse, relative or friend. Those are easy persons to talk to, and with what Lions do, you have an easy product to sell, but remember, Mission 1.5 is not just about new members. It is also about retaining the members that we have.

Women's Day

March 8, 2025 is International Women's Day. Women are making a huge impact in Lions International and in the clubs in North Dakota. In District 5NE our next two District Governors will be women. Women are also taking an increasing number of positions in our District Clubs, such as President, Secretary, Treasurer and as Board Members. In the recent past we have had 2 women International Presidents and Pat Vannett from North Dakota served on the International Board of Directors. March 8 is a day to honor the women Lions



in North Dakota for all that they do, from the big things right down to the little details. Join us in Bismarck on March 8 for a celebration of Women in Lions. Further details are in this issue.
