

5NE DISTRICT GOVERNOR'S REPORT

Spring Renewal

Springtime is a time of renewal. As Lions, it is a good time to renew our commitment to our communities and the causes that Lions support. At my club we recite the Lion's Creed at every meeting. In looking to our renewal we should reexamine who we are as Lions. The Lion's Creed states as follows:

WHO IS A LION?

One who achieves success, lives well, laughs often, loves all humankind, gains the respect of intelligent people and the love of little children.

Who fills a niche, does work well, and makes God's world a better place than it was, by just a brighter flower, a perfect poem, a human soul awake to its own loveliness.

Who feels the glow of beauty in all life, and never fails to voice praise of it.

Who sees the best there is in others, and gives to them the best there is within.

Whose life is one vast inspiration.

THAT PERSON IS A LION

While there are different versions of the creed, they all basically have the same meaning. I would like to highlight a few areas of the creed as we seek to reenergize and recommit to what it is about being a Lion.

One line begins with the statement that Lions fill a niche. Within our clubs we are not called to fill all positions or to be that person that must do everything. Each of us should find that area that we can best help our club with. One of the things that I hear in making my visitations is that the club members are getting older and are dropping out because they cannot do what they used to. For most of you, your role in your club will change as you age. Even though you might not be able to physically do what you did in the past, you

are still an important Lion. Your advice and ideas are still valuable to your club. You can still mentor new Lions. There are little jobs that you can still do in your club's service projects. You can support the other members of your club with a supportive phone call or a good word. You can be a voice of praise. Look for ways to stay involved even though it might not be on a level that is as active as you once were.

Another line of the creed says that a Lion laughs often. Look for ways to have fun. You are serving side by side with members of your club who are your friends. Take the time to smile, laugh and enjoy those friendships. Laughter and smiling are infectious and others will want to be a part of a club that has fun. That will help your club to grow.

If I were to sum up the overall theme of the creed

I would say that it is "Lions are positive people". Every single club has its struggles, some more than others. Don't give up. Be positive. We can make our clubs better by remembering who we are as Lions. We also have many resources available to our clubs when questions or struggles Those include your arise. zone chairs and your district leaders. Get them involved if there are problems. In addition, Lions International publishes many resources that may be of assistance. Gatherings, such as the Spring Rally, which is scheduled this year for April 14 in Fargo is a great place to share with other Lions from around the district what is happening in your club and to seek and share solutions. Celebrate new clubs coming on board. Lisbon will be celebrating their new club on March 14, 2025 at the Opera House in Lisbon starting

A number of years ago I had the pleasure of meeting Past International President Bill Biggs, who was from North Dakota. He asked me to step forward into a position of leadership. When I hesitated, he said "Kirk, you are a Lion. The answer is yes". Let's renew and recharge ourselves this spring. I like to think that our club members are not getting older, they are getting better. So in this time of renewal, start with yourself. Reread the Lion's Creed and recommit to being that person. When others see you, do they say "THAT PERSON IS A LION"? You are a Lion. The answer should be "YES!".

February was a very busy month for District 5NW Lions. We all got back into action with club extension, fund-raising, leadership training, marketing, membership, service, club visits, and zone meetings.

Our efforts to start new clubs in Mohall and Garrison are once again underway, so please let me know if you have a friend or family member in or near those communities that we can invite to become a Lion.

Peace Poster kits are now available. If you want an early start contact Lion Sherry Fetch to have your kit mailed, otherwise you can pick it up at Spring Rally.

Your cabinet has become aware that LCI has more than \$9,000 available to our 5NW clubs for Community Impact Grants. We plan to help our new clubs get started in service with a portion of that and will also assist all clubs



that are interested in submitting a grant application.


